

1. GETTING TO KNOW YOUR PHONE

1.1. Handset Overview



1. OK

In idle mode: Press to access the main menu.

In sub-menu mode: Press to confirm the selection.

During a call: Press to access Intercom/Phonebook/Redial List/Call List.

*In main menu mode: Press to go to Call Block Setting menu
In ringing mode: Press to block incoming call* if **Block Set.** is set to ON

In idle mode: Press to access the phonebook.

In menu mode: Press to scroll up the menu items.

In Phonebook list / Redial list / Call List: Press to scroll up the list.

During a call: Press to increase the volume.

In ringing: Press to increase the ringer volume.

In menu mode: Press to scroll down the menu items.

In Phonebook list / Redial list / Call List: Press to scroll down the list.

During a call: Press to decrease the volume.

In ringing: Press to decrease the ringer volume.

5.

During a call: Press to end a call and go back to idle screen.

In menu / editing mode: Press to go back to previous menu.

In menu / editing mode: Press and hold to go back to idle screen. In editing / predialing mode: Press to clear a character / digit.

During ringing: Press to set ring volume off.

6. M1, M2, M3

In idle mode /During a call: Press to dial pre-recorded number stored in **Direct Mem**.

7. **#** key

Press to insert #

In idle mode: Press and hold to access the call list.

In predialling mode / during a call: Press and hold to insert pause.

8. 💥 key

Press to insert *

In idle mode: press and hold to access the redial list.

9. ALPHANUMERIC KEYPAD

Press to insert a digit / character / * / #

0 key in predialing / number editing mode:

Press and hold to insert a flash

1, 2, 3 key in idle/off hook mode, press and hold to dial the stored direct memory number.

0 key during a call:

Press and hold to start conference call (in intercom mode).

In idle / predialing mode : Press to make a call.

In Redial list / Call List / Phonebook entry:

Press to make a call to the selected entry in the list.

During ringing: Press to answer a call.

During a call: Press to switch to speaker mode.

11. HANDSET LED - N-

During charging: On steadily.


In ringing mode / Paging mode: Flashing quickly.

When new voice mail: Flash slowly

12. AUDIO BOOST 🏿 🕈

During a call: Press to audio boost on/off(inactive in speakerphone mode).

1.2. Base Station Overview





1. 🐧

Press the Page on the base station to page your handset. It will ring for approximately 60 seconds.

Press and hold \(\bigcolon \) on the base station for about five seconds, the base station will enter into registration mode and is ready for handset registration.

1.3. Display Icons and Symbols





Steadily on when the handset is in range of the base.

Flashes when out of range of the base or not registered to the base.

Steadily on indicates a call is in progress. Flashes when there is an incoming call.

Flashes when there is an incoming call.

Indicates that handsfree is being used.

Steadily on when an alarm is set.

Flashes when the alarm time set before reaches.

Indicates when there are received new Voice Message Waiting (VMWI) not yet read.

Indicates that the ringer is switched off.

Indicates when the battery is fully charged.

Whole icon flashes when the battery performs initial charging.

Internal block icon flashes when the battery is in final charging stage.

Flashes when low battery power level is detected.

On indicates it's a new call which has not been read in call log and * will be shown in the end of call number or name. After read, * will disappear. Flashes when the call list is being accessed.

- ${f J}{f +}$ On indicates audio boost is on (earpiece of handset will be louder).
- Flashes when phonebook is being accessed.
- Flashes when redial list is being accessed.

Hearing Aid Compatibility:

• Special feature which helps to eliminate background noise and interference when you use this telephone with a hearing aid.

2. PRECAUTIONS

The signal quality will depend on the location and environment of the base and handset.

Position your BigTel 1500 / 1502 /1503 away from sources of excessive heat (radiators, direct sunlight, etc.) and protect it from vibrations and dust. Never allow your telephone to come into contact with water or other liquids, or with aerosols. To reduce the risk of interference and optimize reception, take particular care not to install the base in the immediate vicinity of windows, large metal objects, reinforced concrete, televisions, music centres, halogen lamps or heating devices, fluorescent lighting, burglar alarms, microwave ovens, computers, etc.

This telephone requires an electrical power supply in order to function.

To clean your BigTel $1500 \ / \ 1502 \ / 1503$ use an antistatic cloth lightly moistened with water.

3. INSTALLING YOUR PHONE

3.1. Connecting the Base Station

- Plug one end of the telephone line cord into the telephone jack on base bottom.
- 2. Plug the small end of power adapter into a power jack on base bottom.
- 3. Plug the large end of power adapter into a wall power outlet.
- Plug the other end of the telephone line cord in to the telephone jack or micro-filter.
- 5. Always use the cables provided in the box.



If you have broadband service, a micro-filter(not included) is required.

3.2. Installing and Charging the Batteries

- 1. Slide down to open the battery compartment cover.
- 2. Place the 2 batteries as indicated. Pay extra attention to direction of Respect polarity.
- 3. Slide the battery compartment cover back.
- 4. Put the handset on the base and charge for 8 hours before using the handset for the first time. The handset will give a beep when it is properly placed on the base or charger.

Notes:

Use only NiMH rechargeable batteries.


If the handset will not be used for a long time, disconnect and remove the batteries to prevent possible leakage.



3.3. Connecting the Charger(s) (for Duo/Trio models)

Plug the power adapter into a 230Vac, 50Hz mains socket.

After first time power up (base unit is connected to AC mains), welcome mode (country) will appear on the screen:



Note: For Duo or Trio versions, all you have to do is configure a single handset, the other handset (s) will be automatically set identically.

Change language (Handset)


- Press OK on the handset in idle mode.



4. USING YOUR PHONE

4.1. Make a Call

4.1.1. Preparatory Dialing

Enter the phone number and press \bigcap to dial the number. Press \bigcap to clear the entry.

4.1.2. Direct Dialing

Press f_{\parallel} to take the line and enter the phone number.

4.1.3. Dial from Direct Memory Keys

In idle or off hook mode,

Press M1, M2 or M3 to dial the stored number.

Press and hold $\sim 1/\frac{1}{6}$ to dial the direct memory number. You have to store number to the related key first. See section 8.3 for reference.

4.1.4. Call from the Redial List

Press and \bigstar hold to access the redial list and press $\overset{\Delta}{\Box}$ / \blacktriangledown to select the desired redial number.

Press 🖊 to dial out to the selected redial number.

4.1.5. Adjust Earpiece and Handsfree Volume

There are 5 levels (Volume 1 to Volume 5) to choose from for each of earpiece and handsfree volume.

During a call:

Press $\stackrel{\triangle}{\boxtimes}$ / \blacktriangledown to select volume 1-5. The current setting is shown. When you end the call, the setting will remain at the last selected level.

The current volume is displayed on the screen.

When you end the call, the new volume setting sound remains valid for subsequent calls.

For the sound level of the handset, if this is not loud enough, press \Re , the audio boost will be activated. To turn off audio boost, press again the key \Re .

5. PRIVATE PHONEBOOK

Your phone can store up to 100 private phonebook entries with names and numbers. Each phonebook entry can have a maximum of 24 digits for the phone number and 12 characters for the name.

You can also select different ringtones for your phonebook entries. Phonebook entries are stored alphabetically by name.

5.1. Add a New Phonebook Entry

In idle:

- Press to access the phonebook. OR
 Press MK and to access the phonebook main menu item and then press MK to access the phonebook.
- 2. Press MENII to select **Add New**.
- 3. Press $\frac{OK}{MENU}$ to enter the name.
- 4. Press OK to enter the number.
- 5. Press $\frac{OK}{MENU}$ and $\frac{A}{10}$ / ∇ to select the desired ringtone for your phonebook entry.
- 6. Press MENU to confirm the melody.
- 7. Press $\stackrel{\triangle}{\square}$ / ∇ to select VIP X or VIP $\sqrt{.}$
- Press ^{DIX}_{MENU} to confirm to save it as normal contact list (VIP X) or save it in VIP list (VIP √).

Note: ! appears in the end of name of VIP entry.

5.2. Call from the Phonebook

In idle:

- Press to access the phonebook. OR
 Press to access the phonebook main menu item and then press to access the phonebook.
- Press / to dial out to the selected phonebook entry. Phonebook is stored in base unit which is shared with duo, trio handsets.

6. CALLER DISPLAY (NETWORK DEPENDENT)*

This feature* is available if you have subscribed the Caller Line Identification service with your telephone service provider. Your phone can store up to 50 received calls with date/time information in the Call List. The number will be shown on the LCD when the phone is ringing.

If the caller number is disabled to send caller information, "Withheld" will display.

If the caller number is not provided, "Out of Area" will display.

In standby, if three unanswered calls are received, "3 New Calls" will be displayed.

6.1. View the Call List

All received calls are saved in Call List with the latest call putting at the top of the list. When the call list is full, the oldest call will be replaced by a new call. The unanswered call which has not been read is marked with .

1. Press and hold # key. OR

Press MENU and $\stackrel{\Delta}{\square}/\nabla$ to select **Call list**, press .

2. Press $\stackrel{\triangle}{\square}$ / ∇ to select the desired entry.

6.2. Call from the Call List

In idle:

1. Press and hold # key. OR

Press and $\stackrel{\Delta}{\bowtie}$ / \blacktriangledown to select Call list, press $^{\square K}_{MENU}$.

Press (to dial out to the selected phonebook entry.

REDIAL THE LAST NUMBER

You can redial up to 10 of the last numbers called.

In idle mode, press and hold *\ key to access the redial list.

- 1. Press $\stackrel{\triangle}{\text{m}}$ / ∇ to browse the redial list.
- 2. Press 🜈 to dial the selected redial number.

8. PHONE SETTING

8.1. Set the Ringer Melody for Internal/External Calls

- 1. Press $\underset{\text{MENU}}{\text{DK}}$ and $\underset{\text{MENU}}{\overset{\triangle}{\text{MENU}}}$ / \checkmark to select **HS Settings**.
- 2. Press $_{\text{MENU}}^{\text{OK}}$ and $_{\text{MENU}}^{\Delta}$ / ∇ to select **Ring Setup**.
- 3. Press $\underset{MENU}{\text{OK}}$ and $\underset{M}{\overset{\Delta}{\cap}}$ / ∇ to select **Int Ring** or **Ext Ring**.

Note: The respective ringer melody will be played while browsing the melody list.

5. Press $_{MENU}^{OK}$ to confirm.

8.2. Set the Ringer Volume

- 1. Press $_{\text{MENU}}^{\text{OK}}$ and $_{\text{DI}}^{\triangle}$ / ∇ to select **HS Settings**.
- 2. Press $_{\text{MENU}}^{\text{OK}}$ and $_{\text{DI}}^{\text{A}}$ / ∇ to select **Ring Setup**.

- 3. Press $_{\text{MENU}}^{\text{OK}}$ and $_{\text{DI}}^{\triangle}$ / ∇ to select **Ring Volume**.

Note: The respective ringer volume will be played during your selection.

If OFF is selected, * icon will display.

5. Press OK to confirm.

8.3. Set the Speed Dial

- 1. Press $\underset{MENU}{\text{OK}}$ and $\overset{\triangle}{\square}$ or \blacktriangledown to select **Direct Mem**.
- 2. Press, and then press the memory key M1 / M2 / M3 / \sim 1 / $^{\circ}$ 2 / $^{\circ}$ 3.

For M1/M2/M3:

- 1. Press OK to input name.
- 2. Press OK to enter number.
- 3. Press $_{MENU}^{DK}$ to browse the melody list, and then press to confirm the melody,
- Press nor vip vio select vip x or vip √.
- 5. Press $^{\text{ICK}}_{\text{MENU}}$ to confirm to save it as normal contact list (VIP X) or save it in VIP list (VIP $\sqrt{}$).

For ~1/ 12/13:

1. Press $_{\text{MENU}}^{\text{OK}}$ to input number, and then press to confirm.

8.4. Set handset Settings

- 1. In standby mode, press the menu key MENU.
- 2. Select **HS Settings** and press MENU.
- Display: Select Contrast and set the desired contrast
 or
- select **Rename HS** and change the name for the handset if necessary.
- Date & Time: Select Date & Time and set Date Format, Time Format and Set Time/Date.
- Tone Setup: Select Tone Setup and set on or off in Key Tone, Battery Tone or Out of Range.
- Language: Select the setting for the on-screen language.
- Automatic answer: If this function is activated, an incoming call is accepted directly when removing the handset from the base station, you do not need to press any button.
- Reset phone: Select Default, you can reset the system to its factory default state. Enter the PIN (default "0000") and confirm the security question with MEN.
- Equalizer: This function allows you to modify the sound quality of the handset. During the call, press the menu key MENU. Select Normal, Bass or Treble and press MENU to save the setting.

8.5. Set Base

- 1. In standby mode, press the menu key OK MENU.
- 2. Select **BS Settings** and press MENIL.
- Dial mode: Select Tone or Pulse. The normal dialing procedure for analog connections is "Tone" (tone dialing). When operating with certain older telephone systems the dialing procedure should be changed to "Pulse" (decadic pulse dialing).
- **Delete HS**: Enter the PIN of the base station and select the handset you want to delete. Confirm the security question with $\frac{\partial V}{\partial t}$.
- Flash duration: Choose 100 ms, 270 ms or 600 ms. In order to use the network performance characteristics, a certain flash signal with a certain length is required.
- Change PIN: Select Change PIN?, and enter Old PIN, press OK and then enter New PIN, press OK Confirm.
- Eco Mode: Select On or Off and press OK MENII.

9. REGISTRATION

Your handset and base station is pre-registered.

Up to 4 handsets can be registered to a single base station.

If for some reason, the handset is not registered to the base station \blacksquare flashes even when the handset is near the base station).

- Press and hold on the base station for about five seconds, the base station is entered into registration mode.
- 2. Press $\prod_{M \in M} A \cap M = M$ to select Registration.
- 3. Press OK and select the destination base you would like to register to.
- Press ^{DK}_{MENU} and you are requested to enter the 4-digit system PIN. Enter the 4-digit system PIN (default PIN is 0000).
- 5. Press OK to confirm.

If the handset registration is successful, you will hear a confirmation tone and the \prod will stop flashing.

If the handset registration is unsuccessful, the **III** will still flash.

10. CALL BLOCK

This telephone is built-in with Smart Call Block feature*.

This feature will help you avoid nuisance calls by only allowing some numbers to make your phone ring.

Default setting of Smart Call Block in this telephone is **OFF** but you can enable it via your phone settings, as explained in the following paragraphs. *This feature requires a subscription of Caller Line Identification service from your telephone service provider.

CALL BLOCK OVERVIEW

Settings	Explanations
Off	Call Block function (Block all call with numbers) is Disabled. This is the default mode.
On	Call Block function is set to Manual. Numbers registered in the black list will not go through and the phone will ring silently. Numbers can be added to the list while the phone is ringing and / or after a call(to enable, see part 10.1).
Contacts	In this automatic mode, any number not registered to your phonebook will be automatically be blocked and not cause your phone to ring. All calls from contacts registered to your phonebook will proceed normally. When this mode is chosen, Contacts OK is displayed on LCD in idle mode unless you have unread messages/missed calls (to enable, see part 10.2.2).
VIPS	In this second automatic mode, only calls from contacts registered as VIP in your phonebook will go through and cause your phone to ring. Any other number will not ring. When this mode is chosen, VIPS OK is displayed on the LCD in idle mode unless you have unread messages / missed calls (to enable, see part 10.2.1).
Anonymous	This extra feature allows you to block call that do not have a number attached to them (ie private calls, international calls, etc). This option can be enabled on top of any of the previous four (to enable, see part 10.3).

10.1. Manual call block mode


Manual call block is the easiest option when starting out. When you chose **ON** in the call block settings, all calling numbers registered in your blacklist will be blocked. You can add/remove numbers from that list at any time.

How to block an incoming call:

When the phone is ringing and before answering, press ${\bf Q}$. It will terminate the call and offer you the option to register the number to the blacklist in one click.

Then to confirm the registration of this number in the blacklist, press $^{OK}_{\text{MENJ}}$. IMPORTANT: if you don't confirm, the number will not be added to the blacklist and the next call will go through normally.

10.1.1. Enable MANUAL mode

10.1.2. Add numbers to Blacklist

In idle mode,

- Press key, Block set. is displayed, or Press key to press of or ▼ to select Call block, press key to show Block set.
- Press not or ▼ to select Blocklist.
- Press OK of New of

NOTE: 2 more ways to add incoming and outgoing call numbers in Block list:

- From incoming call numbers
- Press MENU, press MENU or ∇ to select call list entry.
- Press $^{\text{DK}}_{\text{MENU}}$, press $^{\triangle}_{\square}$ or \blacktriangledown to select to **Add to Block**.
- Press $\frac{OK}{MENL!}$ to show selected number, press \bigstar to save to **Block list**.
- 2. From outgoing call numbers
- Press and hold ★ key, press not are to select redial list entry.
- Press ^{OK}_{MENU}, press ^A_M or ▼ to select to Add to Block.
- Press MENU to show selected number, press MENU to save to Block list.

10.1.3. Edit numbers in Blacklist

In idle mode,

- 1. Repeat step 1 and 2 in Section 10.1.2.
- 2. Press ^{OK}_{MENU}, press ^{OK}_{MENU} or ▼ to select **Edit**, press ^{OK}_{MENU} or ▼ to select number to be edited, press ^{OK}_{MENU} to edit, and then press ^{OK}_{MENU} to save.

10.1.4. Delete numbers in Blacklist

10.1.4.1. Delete a number from blacklist

In idle mode,

- 1. Repeat step 1 and 2 in Section 10.1.2.



10.2. Automatic call block mode

10.2.1. VIPs only

In this restrictive automatic mode, only calls from numbers registered as VIP in your phonebook will go through and make your phone ring.



- 1. Press $\stackrel{\text{OK}}{\bowtie}$, press $\stackrel{\triangle}{\bowtie}$ or \blacktriangledown to select **Call Block**.
- 2. Press $^{OK}_{MENU}$, press $^{\triangle}_{\square}$ or \blacktriangledown to select **Block set**.
- 3. Press $\stackrel{\text{OK}}{\bowtie}$, press $\stackrel{\Delta}{\bowtie}$ or \blacktriangledown to select **VIP OK** (Automatic mode).

10.2.2. Contacts only

In this broad automatic mode, only calls from contacts registered in your phonebook (normal and VIP) will go through and make your phone ring.

- 1. Press $\stackrel{\text{OK}}{\bowtie}$, press $\stackrel{\triangle}{\bowtie}$ or \blacktriangledown to select **Call Block**.
- 2. Press $_{\text{MENU}}^{\text{OK}}$, press $\stackrel{\triangle}{\text{m}}$ or \blacktriangledown to select **Block set**.
- 3. Press $_{\text{MENU}}^{\text{OK}}$, press $_{\text{DI}}^{\mathbf{A}}$ or $\mathbf{\nabla}$ to select **Contacts OK** (Automatic mode).

10.3. Anonymous call block mode

This feature allows you to block numbers that do not display a number on your phone. It can be enabled or disabled independently from the previous call block modes.



- Press $_{\text{MENU}}^{\text{OK}}$, press $_{\text{MI}}^{\triangle}$ or ∇ to select **Call Block**. 1.
- Press $_{MENL}^{OK}$, press $_{MI}^{A}$ or ∇ to select **Block anonym**. 2.
- Press $^{OK}_{MENII}$, press $^{\triangle}_{DI}$ or ∇ to select one of the options. 3.

10.3.1. Block Private Calls

This mode will block incoming calls that have been purposely kept their numbers private from you.

In idle mode,

- Press key, Block set. is displayed, or 1. Press ^{OK}_{MENI}, press [♠] or **▼** to select **Call block**, press of to show **Block set**.
- Press $\stackrel{\triangle}{\cap}$ or ∇ to select **Block anonym**. 2.
- Press $M_{\text{MENII}}^{\text{DK}}$, press M_{T}^{A} or ∇ to select **Private**, press $M_{\text{MENII}}^{\text{DK}}$ to confirm. 3.
- will be displayed on the lower side of LCD. 4.

10.3.2. Block All Anonymous Calls

This mode will block all incoming calls, including private calls, international calls, pay phone and other out-of-area calls.

10.3.3. Set Block Anonymous Calls OFF

12. TROUBLESHOOTING
