


INSTALLATION

Recommendations

- Do not expose the phone to direct sunlight or excessive temperature.
- Operating temperature between + 5 ° C and + 40 ° C.
- Your phone must be installed at least 1 meter away from radio equipment such as television, cell phone, etc.

Telephone installation

- Your phone should be placed on a flat surface for more stability.Plug the coiled cord into the handset (A) and into the socket on the left side of the phone (B).
- Plug the small end of power adapter into power jack on base (D)
- Plug the large end of power adapter into a wall outlet (E)
- Plug the telephone cord into the socket at the back of the set and into the wall outlet (C) or into the telephone port of the internet box.For desktop position, raise the 2 feet under the base (F).



First Power on setup

An on-screen installation will guide you to setup your phone language , date and time when first power on. You can later change your setting by follow select language page 8.

Wall mounting

- Fold the 2 feet under the base (F).
- Flip the small plastic piece on the base (13).
- Drill two 6mm holes spaced 100mm apart.Insert 2 wall plugs and screw in the wood screws (3.5 mm in diameter and 30 mm long).
- Mount the base to the 2 screws by pulling it downwards.

GENERAL USE

PT196 is a FULL DUPLEX phone, allowing you to enjoy simultaneous 2-way conversation without any acoustic feedback, in the receiver during normal conversation as well as in handsfree mode conversation.

Make a call

- Pick up the handset or press the IC key.
- Dial the number using the keypad.
- To end the call : Put back the handset on the base or press the \mathbb{I} key.

Call from memories

- Pick up the handset or press 🛛 key.
- Press M1 , M2 or + ▲ / ▼ + Call.
- At the end of the call, hang up the handset or press the \mathbb{I} key.

Dial back an outgoing number

- Press the 🌰 key.
- Press \blacktriangle or \blacksquare to select the number.
- Pick up the handset or press the Π key.

Answering a call

- To answer : pick up the handset or press the IC key (hands-free mode).
- To hang up : replace the handset on the base or press the II key.

Set hands-free volume

During (hands-free) conversation :

- Press \clubsuit to increase the volume.
- Press $\mathbf{\nabla}$ to decrease the volume.
- 8 levels can be selected.

Set ringer volume

Slide the switch to adjust the ringer volume 🎋 🌲 🔔 .

Note : When the ringer is off, the call light will still flash to indicate an incoming call.

Set handset volume (and audio-boost)

During handset conversation, 2 modes of amplification are available:

Standard mode

Press \triangle or ∇ to increase or decrease (8 levels).

• Audio boost mode (extra strong upto + 60db)

During handset conversation, press the \mathfrak{P} + key. Press this button again to stop amplification.

A slider on the back of the phone (AMPLIFY) is used to always activate the audio boost function. By default, the position is "OFF" If it is in the "ON" position, the audio boost will be automatically activated at each call.

Equalizer

Choose the sound profile that suits you best.

Slide the switch to adjust the handset receiver sound frequency pitch

(3 selections) the .

PROGRAMMING

Select contrast

- 1. Press Menu.

Set Flash Time

- 4. Press \blacktriangle or \bigtriangledown to select the required flash time. Press **OK**.
- 5. Press 🗩 to return to standby.

Ringer tone

You can set different ringer tones for your calls. Choose from 20 different tones.

You will hear a sample ring as you scroll to each ring tone.

- 1. Press Menu.
- 2. Press \blacktriangle or \blacksquare to select **Settings**. Press **OK**.
- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select Ringer tone. Press OK.
- 4. Press \blacktriangle or \bigtriangledown to select the required ringer tone. Press **OK**.
- 5. Press 🖆 to return to standby.

Call blocker

This telephone is built-in with Smart Call Block feature*. This feature will help you avoid nuisance calls by only allowing some numbers to make your phone ring. Default setting of Smart Call Block in this telephone is OFF but you can enable it via your phone settings, as explained in the following paragraphs.

*This feature requires a subscription of Caller Line Identification service from your telephone service provider.

Call block overview


1. Manual call block mode

Manual call block is the easiest option when starting out. When you chose **ON** in the call block settings, all calling numbers registered in your blacklist will be blocked. You can add/remove numbers from that list at any time.

How to block an incoming call:

When the phone is ringing and before answering, press **(7)**. It will terminate the call and offer you the option to register the number to the blacklist in one click. Then to confirm the registration of this number in the blacklist, press **OK**. IMPORTANT: if you don't confirm, the number will not be added to the blacklist and the next call will go through normally.

1.1. Enable MANUAL mode



Press OK, press \blacktriangle or \blacksquare to select Call block.

Press OK, press \blacktriangle or \blacksquare to select **Block set**.

Press OK, press **A** or **T** to select On (manual mode).

OR

In idle mode, press **7** to access **Block set.** directly.

After you enable this option, the call block icon 🕜 will be displayed on the LCD.

1.2. Add numbers to Blocklist

In idle mode,

- Press ♥ key, Call block and its icon is displayed, Press OK then press ▲ or ▼ to select Blocklist, press OK to show Blocklist.
- 2. Press \blacktriangle or \bigtriangledown to select numbers stored in **Blocklist**.
- 3. Press **Options** to select **Add**, enter number to be blocked, press **Save key** to save.

NOTE: 2 more ways to add incoming and outgoing call numbers in Block list:

- 1. From incoming call numbers
- Press ♥ ?▲, to enter Call list, press ▲ or ♥ to select the stored numbers in CALL LIST.
- Press **Options**, press **A** or **T** to select the **Block number**.
- Press OK to show selected number, press Save to save to Block list.
- 2. From outgoing call numbers
- Press (● , press ▲ or ▼ to select redial list entry.

1.3. Edit numbers in Blocklist

In idle mode,

- 1. Repeat step 1 and 2 in Section 1.2. to select the stored numbers.
- 2. Press **Options**, press ▲ or ▼ to select **Edit**, start to edit selected number press **OK** to save.

1.4. Delete numbers in Blocklist 1.4.1. Delete a number from blocklist

- 1. Repeat step 1 and 2 in Section 1.2. to select the stored numbers.
- 2. Press **Options**, press ▲ or ▼ to select **DELETE**, **Are you sure?** is shown, and then press **Yes** to confirm.


1.4.2. Delete all numbers from blocklist

In idle mode,

- 1. Repeat step 1 and 2 in Section 1.2. to select the stored numbers.
- 2. Press **Options**, press ▲ or ▼ to select **Delete all** number to delete at a time, press **OK**, **Are you sure?** is shown, and then press **OK** to confirm.

2. Automatic call block mode 2.1. VIPs only

In this restrictive automatic mode, only calls from numbers registered as VIP in your phonebook will go through and make your phone ring.



Press Menu, press \blacktriangle or \bigtriangledown to select Call block.

Press OK, press \blacktriangle or \bigtriangledown to select **Block set**.

Press OK, press ▲ or ▼ to select VIP OK (Automatic mode).

2.2. Contacts only

In this broad automatic mode, only calls from contacts registered in your phonebook (normal and VIP) will go through and make your phone ring.

Press Menu, press **(** or **(** to select Call block.

Press OK, press \blacktriangle or \blacksquare to select **Block set**.

Press OK, press **A** or **V** to select **Contacts OK** (Automatic mode).

3. Anonymous call block mode

This feature allows you to block numbers that do not display a number on your phone. It can be enabled or disabled independently from the previous call block modes.



Press Menu, press **()** or **()** and Press OK to select Call block.

Press \blacktriangle or \bigtriangledown to select **Block anonymous**.

Press **OK**, press \blacktriangle or \blacksquare to select one of the options.

3.1. Block Private Calls

This mode will block incoming calls that have been purposely kept their numbers private from you.

In idle mode,

- 1. Press **7** key, **Call block** and its icon is displayed, press **OK**.
- 2. Press \blacktriangle or \bigtriangledown to select **Block anonymous**.
- 3. Press OK, press ▲ or ▼ to select Private, press OK to confirm.
- 4. Press Back twice .
- 5. Ø will be displayed on the upper side of LCD.

3.2. Block All Anonymous Calls

This mode will block all unknown incoming calls, including private calls, international calls, pay phone and other out-of-area calls.

In idle mode,

- 1. Repeat step 1 and 2 in Section 3.1.
- 2. Press OK, press **A** or **T** to select ALL, press OK to confirm.
- 3. **(7** After you enable this option, the call block icon will be displayed on the LCD.

3.3. Set Block Anonymous Calls OFF

In idle mode,

- 1. Repeat step 1 and 2 in Section 3.1.
- 2. Press OK, press **A** or **V** to select Off, press OK to confirm.
- 3. Ø will only disappear from the LCD if the regular call block (see 1. And 2.) is also set to OFF.

Key tones

When you press a button on the keypad, you will hear a beep. You can switch these beeps on or off.

- 1. Press Menu.
- 2. Press \blacktriangle or \bigtriangledown to select **Settings**. Press **OK**.
- 3. Press \blacktriangle or \bigtriangledown to select Keypad tones. Press OK.
- 4. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Tones on** or **Tones off**. Press **OK**.
- 5. Press **5** to return to standby.

Confirmation tones

When you confirm a setting, you will hear a beep. You can switch these beeps on or off.

Caller ID and calls list

Important

To use Caller ID, you must first subscribe to the service from your network provider. A subscription fee may be payable.

To ensure that the caller's name is displayed, make sure you have stored the full telephone number, including the area code in the phonebook.

Caller ID

If subscribed to Caller ID, the caller's number will be displayed (provided it is not withheld) prior to answering the call.

Call list

The call list stores details of the last 30 received calls and missed calls, including the phone number and date of the call.

View the call list

- 1. Press **▼** ? to open the calls list. If there are no calls in the list, the display shows List empty.
- 2. Press \blacktriangle or \bigtriangledown to scroll through the list.
- 3. When you reach the end of the list the display will show ----End----

Dial a number in the call list

- 1. Press **T** to open the calls list.
- 2. Press \blacktriangle or \bigtriangledown to the entry you want.
- 3. Lift the handset to dial the number, or press 🛙 to dial the number over hands-free.

Copy a call list number to the phonebook

- 1. Press **T** to open the calls list.

- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select Save number. Press OK.
- 4. Enter the name. Press Next.

Date and time

If you have subscribed to Caller ID Service, the date and time is set automatically when you receive your first call.

If you do not have Caller ID service, you can set the date and time manually.

Set the date and time

- 1. Press Menu.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select Time & date. Press OK.
- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select Set time & date. Press OK.
- 4. Enter the time using the keypad (e.g. 06--30 for 6:30am). Press Next.
- 5. Use the keypad to enter the date using the format **DD/MM/YYYY**. Press **Save**.
- 6. Press 🔄 to return to standby.

Set the time format

You can use a 24 hour or 12 hour format to display the time on your phone. To set your preference:

- 1. Press Menu.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select Set time & date. Press OK.
