

QUICK SETUP

Set Language

After first time power up (base station is also connected to main power, for details, refer to Section 5.1.2.). LANGUAGE? will appear on the screen.



- 1. Press Ok on the handset.
- 2. Press \triangle or ∇ to select the desired language.
- 3. Press **Ok**. Your hear confirmation tones and OK will appear on the screen.



OR

- 1. Press **Ok** on the handset in idle mode.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **HS Setting**, then press **Ok**.
- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Date / Time**, then press **Ok** .
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Set Date, then press Ok, Input the day, month, year, then press Ok, input hour (24HR format), and minutes, then press Ok, You hear confirmation tones.

Note: if digit is input wrong during input Date or Time, you can press \triangle or ∇ to select the right position and input correct digit.



2. LOCATION

For maximum coverage and reduce the interference, here are some guidelines you should consider where you place the base unit,

- place it at a convenient, high, and central location with no obstructions between the handset and base unit in an indoor environment.
- place it away from electronic appliances such as televisions, microwave ovens, radios, personal computers, wireless devices or other cordless phones.
- avoid facing radio frequency transmitters, such as external antennas of mobile phone cell stations.
- avoid plugging it into the same circuit as other major household electrical appliances because of the potential for interference.

Try moving the appliance or the base unit to another power outlet.


If the reception for a base unit location is not satisfactory, move it to another location for better reception. Depending on the surrounding conditions as well as spatial and structural factors, the range may be reduced. The range indoors is normally less than outdoors.


Connecting the Base Station

- 1. Plug one end of the telephone line cord into the telephone jack on base bottom.
- 2. Plug the small end of power adapter into a power jack on base bottom.
- 3. Plug the large end of power adapter into a wall power outlet.
- 4. Plug the other end of the telephone line cord in to the telephone jack or micro-filter.
- 5. Always use the cables provided in the box.



3.2. Connecting the Charger

Plug the power adapter into a power outlet.




If you have a Broadband line.

If you connect your telephone to a line with a broadband connection, you will need to insert a micro-filter between the telephone and the telephone line, otherwise you may get interference between the telephone and the broadband, which could cause problems.

In a fixed line with broadband, every telephone must have a micro-filter connected, not just the one at the telephone point that your modem is connected to. If you need more broadband micro-filters, contact your broadband supplier

3.3. Installing and charging the batteries


- 1. Slide down to open the battery compartment cover.
- 2. Place the 3 supplied AAA-size NiMH rechargeable batteries as indicated. Pay extra attention to direction of polarity.



- 3. Slide the battery compartment cover back.
- 4. Put the handset on the base and charge for 15 hours before using the handset for the first time. Notes:
- 1. Use only the supplied NiMH rechargeable battery cells.
- 2. If the handset will not be used for a long time, disconnect and remove the batteries to prevent possible leakage.





- 2. Add new appears then press ▲ or ▼ to select Edit, press OK to edit the number.
- Press DK to edit the name. You hear confirmation tones.

Note: during entering number or name, you can correct a number or a letter by pressing
, then last number or letter will be removed.

6.5. Store phonebook in speed dial

Through telephone base:

- 1. Select a desired entry in the phone book, and then press **Menu**.
- Add new appears then press ▲ or ▼ to select Add to SD, press Ok.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Key 2 to Key 9.
- 4. Press **Ok** to confirm. You hear confirmation tones.

Through cordless handset:

- 1. Select a desired entry in the phone book, and then press $\mathbb{O}_{K_{\text{NNI}}}^{\text{K}}$.
- Add new appears then press ▲ or ▼ to select Add to SD, press OK MENU.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Key 2 to Key 9.
- 4. Press $\frac{OK}{MENLI}$ to confirm. You hear confirmation tones.

6.6. Delete a Phonebook Entry

Through telephone base:

- 1. Select a desired entry in the phone book, and then press **Menu**.
- Add new appears then press ▲ or ▼ to select Delete, press Ok.
- 3. **Confirm?** will display, press **Ok** to confirm. You hear confirmation tones

Through cordless handset:

- 1. Select a desired entry in the phone book, and then press MENU.
- Add new appears then press ▲ or ▼ to select Delete, press MENU.
- 3. **Confirm?** will display, press of to confirm. You hear confirmation tones.

6.7. Add to speed dial key

Through telephone base:

- 1. Select a desired entry in the phone book, and then press **Menu**.
- Add new appears then press ▲ or ▼ to select Add to SD, press Ok.
- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Key 2, ... Key 9**, press **Ok** to confirm. You hear confirmation tones.

Through cordless handset:

- 1. Select a desired entry in the phone book, and then press $\frac{\mathsf{DK}}{\mathsf{MENU}}$.
- Add new appears then press ▲ or ▼ to select Add to SD, press MENU.
- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Key 2, ... Key 9**, press MF_{N 1} to confirm. You hear confirmation tones.

6.8. Status of phonebook

You can view how many phonebook records are stored out of total 100 records.

Through both Cordless Hanset and Telephone Base:

- 1. Press 🔘 , press 🖳 .
- 2. Add new appears then press ▲ or ▼ to select Status, press Ok.
- 3. X / 100 Used will display.

PHONE SETTINGS

7.1. Set Ringer Melody and Volume

For Telephone base:

- Press Menu and ▲ or ▼ to select BS Settings, then press Ok.
- And ▲ or ▼ to select BS Ringer, then press Ok.
- 3. After selection, press to confirm setting. You hear confirmation tones.

Notes:

Ext. Ring means ring tone (total 12 for handset, 12 for base) will ring when external call.

Int. Ring means ring tone (total 12 for handset) will ring when internal call (between base and handset, or among 2 or more handsets registered to the base).

Ring Vol is for: Off (ringer is off), Volume 1 to Volume 5.

When the telephone is ringing, you can temporarily set silence for the ringer of the handset by pressing only without disconnecting the call.

The next call rings normally at the preset volume.

For cordless handset:

- Press MENU on the handset in idle mode.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select HS Setting, then press OK MENU.
- 3. Select **Ring Setup** by pressing $\bigcap_{M \in \mathbb{N}_{1}} .$
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Ext. Ring, Int. Ring or Ring Volume, then press OK MENI.
- 5. After selection, press $\frac{OK}{MENII}$ to confirm setting. You hear confirmation tones.

7.2. Set Alert Tone

You can turn on the alert tone in the cordless handset when low battery/out of range is detected and key tone can be on or off.

- 1. Press $\underset{MENU}{\square K}$ when idle.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select HS Setting, then press MENU.
- 3. Press \triangle or ∇ to select **Tone Setup** then press $_{\text{MENU}}^{\text{DK}}$.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Key Tone, Batt. Tone, or Out Of Range, then press MENU.
- 5. Press \triangle or ∇ to select **On** or **Off**, then press $\bigcup_{M \in \mathbb{N}_1}^{K}$. You hear confirmation tones.

7.3. Set the Date and Time

Through telephone base:

- Press Menu and ▲ or ▼ to select BS Settings.
- Press Ok and ▲ or ▼ to select Date/Time.
- Press Ok and ▲ or ▼ to select Date Format.
- 4. Press **Ok** and ▲ or ▼ to select your desired date format (**DD-MM-YY** or **MM-DD-YY**) or

Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Time Format**, then press MENU, select your desired time format (**24HR** or **12HR**).

Press **Ok** to confirm.

Through cordless handset:

- 1. Press $\underset{MENU}{\square K}$ when idle.
- 2. Press \triangle or ∇ to select **HS Settings**, then press $\underset{\text{MENU}}{\square K}$.
- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Date/Time**, then press ^{OK}_{MENI}.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Date Format, then press □K, select your desired date format (DD-MM-YY or MM-DD-YY), OR
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Time Format, then press MENU, select your desired time format (24HR or 12HR).
- 6. Press $\frac{\text{OK}}{\text{MENU}}$ to confirm. You hear confirmation tones.

7.4. Talking Digit

You can turn on or off the audible spoken tone that is spoken when you press the dialing key on handset and Base during predialing during a call.

- Press Menu when idle.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Talk Digit, then press Ok to select On or Off.
- 3. Press **Ok** to confirm. You hear confirmation tones.

Note: spoken language of talking digit is same as what language has been in selected Section 5.1.2.

7.5. Change the Flash Time

Through telephone base:

- Press Ok when idle.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select **BS Setting**, then press **Ok** . 2.
- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Flash Time**, then press **Ok** .
- Press A or T to select your desired flash time.

(Short, Medium, Long are for your selection), then press Ok to confirm. You hear confirmation tones.

7.6. Reset Your Phone

You can reset your phone to the default settings by using handset.

After reset, all your personal settings will be deleted and resumed to default factory settings, but your phonebook and other memories remain unchanged except redial list.

Through telephone base:

- Press **Menu** when idle.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select **BS Setting**, then press **Ok**.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Default**, then press **Ok**, **Confirm?** Is displayed, then press **Ok** to confirm. You hear confirmation tones.

Through cordless handset:

- Press MENII when idle.
- Press A or T to select **HS Setting**, then press MENU. 2.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Default**, then press OK, Confirm? Is displayed, then press OK, to confirm. You hear confirmation tones.

8. **Registration Cordless Handset to Telephone Base**

Registration (Pairing) 8.1.

Your handset and telephone base is pre-registered (paired). If for some reason, the handset is not registered to the base station, **Put On BS** will be displayed on the handset screen. If it is out of base and ___ disappears on the screen, register your handset according to the following procedure.

- 1 Make sure the handset is out of the base and shows **Put On BS** before you begin registration.
- Press and hold Page on the telephone base in idle mode for around 5 seconds until incoming call light LED 2. bar lits on the telephone base.
- Press MENU on handset when idle.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select **HS SETTING**, then press MENU.
- Press \triangle or ∇ to select **Registration**, then press $\Omega_{K_{1}}^{K}$, **Registration** appears on the screen until the 5. handset displays Registered.

If registration fails, the handset displays Impossible.

Please repeat the above procedure.

Locate the Cordless Handset

To locate the handset: On the base, press the key located under PAGE (on display) once.

All the handsets registered to the base will produce the paging tone and "Paging" is displayed on the LCD of the handsets and on the base display.

You can stop the paging by pressing $\boxed{4}$, $\boxed{-}$, on any handset or **Page** on the base again.

Note: If there is an incoming call during paging, the phone will ring with the incoming call instead of paging.

Conference Call

Up to 4 cordless handsets and the telephone base can join an external call at the same time. To join a call with the telephone base:

- Press I to join the call,
- Press again, to exit the call.
- Lift up the Corded handset to join, and return to cradle to exit.

To join a call with a cordless handset:

- Press (ioin the call.
- Press or place the handset in the base or charger to exit the call.

8.4. Transfer a call

During an external call, you can transfer the call from a cordless handset or the telephone base to another system device.

To transfer a call from the telephone base:

During a call,

- If the handset(s) is put in base or charger, just take it away from cradle, the call will be transferred from base to handset automatically.

To transfer a call from a cordless handset:

During a call,

- 1. Press $_{MENU}^{OK}$, then press \triangle or ∇ to select **Intercom**, then press $_{MENU}^{OK}$.
- 2. If you have two or more cordless handsets, press ▲ or ▼ to select the desired device and then press MENU.
- The external call is put on hold and the cordless handset shows Call from Handset 2 or Call from Base destination device rings.
- To answer the call on the destination handset, press , or any dialing key, OR,

To answer the call on the base, press **I** (speaker mode) OR, lift up the corded handset.

Press no on the calling handset to transfer the call to extra handset or base.

8.5. Intercom

Use the intercom feature for conversations between two cordless handsets or between cordless handset and base. In idle mode,

Intercom initiated from telephone base

- 1. Press **Menu** , and then press ▲ or ▼ to select **Intercom**, then press **Ok**.
- 2. If you have two or more cordless handsets, press ▲ or ▼ to select the desired device and then press **Ok**.
- 3. The handset shows **Call from Handset 2**, the destination device rings.
- To answer the call on the destination handset, press (,) or any dialing key.
 OR, To answer the call on the base, press (speaker mode) OR ,lift up the Corded handset to join,and return to cradle to exit.

Intercom initiated from cordless handset

- 1. Press $\boxed{\zeta_4}$, and then press $_{\text{MENU}}^{OK}$, then press \triangle or ∇ to select **Intercom**, then press $_{\text{MENU}}^{OK}$.
- 2. If you have two or more cordless handsets, press \triangle or ∇ to select the desired device and then press $\overset{\square K}{\text{MENU}}$.
- 3. The cordless handset shows Call from Handset 2, the destination device rings.

8.6. Answer a Call / Auto Answer (Cordless handset only)

If the handset is not on the charging cradle:

When the phone rings, press to answer a call.

If the handset is on the Charging cradle and if **Auto Answer** is set to ON:

When the phone rings, pick up the handset directly to answer a call. It is not needed to press the lacktriangle key.

To set the Auto Answer on:

- .. Press **OK** when idle.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **HS Setting**, then press **Ok**.
- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select Auto Answer, then press Ok.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select On.
- 5. Press **Ok** to confirm. You hear confirmation tones.
- To answer the call on the base, press (speaker mode), OR, lift up the Corded handset to join, and return to cradle to exit.

8.7. Enriched ringer

When first call is not picked up and the same caller calls again within 5 minutes, the ringer level of handset and base will be automatically set to maximum, in order to alert people unable to initially hear the phone ring due to hearing loss or being in a location far from the telephone, that the phone is ringing.

To enable enriched ringer:

- 1. Press Menu
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **BS Setting**, then press **Ok**.
- 3. Press \triangle or ∇ to select **Enriched Ringer**, then press **Ok** to select **On**.
- 4. Press **Ok** to confirm. You hear confirmation tones.

To disable enriched ringer.

- 1. Repeat the above item to 1 to 2.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select Enriched Ringer, then press Ok to select Off.
- 3. Press **OK** to confirm. You hear confirmation tones.

9. REMINDER

The reminder feature helps remind you of important events. You can set the reminder to record your voice, or use alarm sound in order to remind you only once, or in daily, Monday to Friday or Saturday to Sunday. Once you set the reminder, the system will alarm you at the alarm time. Each reminder can be up to 2 minutes in length. NOTE: All the procedures described below can also be performed from the telephone base. From there, the only difference is that the icon <code>QKI</code> described below corresponds to the telephone base key.

9.1. Turn on alarm reminder, set time and frequency

Through both cordless handset and telephone base:

- 1. Press **Ok** when idle.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Reminder**, then press **Ok**.
- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select Alarm 1.. Alarm 10, then press Ok.
- 4. On/Off appears then press Ok to select On.
- 5. Enter the time then press **Ok**.
- 6. Press ▲ or ▼ to select frequency Once, Daily, Mon-Fri, Sat-Sun.
- 7. Press **Ok** to confirm. You hear confirmation tones.

9.2. Select melody of the alarm reminder

- 1. Repeat step 1 to 3 in Section 9.1.
- On/Off appears then press ▼ to select Melody, press Ok.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select desired melody.
- 4. Press **OK** to confirm. You hear confirmation tones.

9.3. Rename the alarm reminder

- 1. Repeat step 1 to 3 in Section 9.1.
- 2. On/Off appears then press ▼ to select Rename, press Ok.
- 3. Change name from **Alarm** to the name you desire. (max. 9 letters or digits)
- 4. Press **Ok** to confirm. You hear confirmation tones.

Note: during entering number or name, you can correct a letter by pressing , then last number or letter will be removed.

9.4. Record Voice memo of the alarm reminder

- 1. Repeat step 1 to 3 in Section 9.1.
- On/Off appears then press ▼ to select Voice Tag, press Ok.
- 3. **Playback** appears then press **T** to select **Record**, press **Ok** to start recording.
- 4. **Recording...** appears after beep sound, you can record your voice.
- 5. Press **Ok** to finish your voice recording. Your voice will replay.
- 6. Press to return previous menu or long press to return to standby mode. Notes:
- 1. You can playback your memo voice in step 3 to select Playback, then press Ok. Playing will appear.
- You can delete your memo voice in step 3 to select **Delete**, press **Ok**. Then, **Delete** will appear after the memo is deleted.
- 3. If no voice memo in the alarm reminder, only melody will play for 2 minutes at the alarm time.
- Ok in the first step is replaced by MENU for telephone base: Back is used to correct a letter/ to return previous menu.

10. SPEED DIAL KEYS (KEY 2 TO KEY 9)

You can make use of key 2 to key 9 on handset as speed dial keys, by long pressing it to dial in idle mode or in talk mode.

10.1. Store a speed dial entry

Speed dial key 1 is reserved for our toll free support phone number. This number cannot be removed or changed. Please press this speed dial key to dial support.

Through telephone base:

- Press Menu, press T to select Phonebook, then press Ok.
- 2. Press ▼ to select **Speed Dial**, press **Ok**.
- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Key 2,... Key 9**, then press **Menu**.
- 4. Add new will display, then press Ok.
- 5. Enter a number, then press **Ok**.
- 6. Enter a name, then press **Ok**. You hear confirmation tones
- 7. Press **Back** to return previous menu.

Through cordless handset:

- 1. Press \bigcap_{MENU}^{K} , press ∇ to select **Phonebook**, then press \bigcap_{MENU}^{K} .
- Press ▼ to select Speed Dial, press MENU.



- 3. Press \triangle or ∇ to select **Key 2,... Key 9**, then press $\stackrel{\square K}{\text{MENU}}$.
- 4. Add new will display, then press MENU.
- 5. Enter a number, then press MENU.
- 6. Enter a name, then press MENU. You hear confirmation tones.
- 7. Press to return previous menu or long press to return to standby mode.

10.2. View a speed dial entry

Through both cordless handset and telephone base

- 1. Repeat the step 1 to 3 in Section 10.1.
- 2. View will display, then press Ok.
- 3. The record (number and name) can be viewed.

Press / Back to return previous menu or long press to return to standby mode.

10.3. Edit a speed dial entry

Through both cordless handset and telephone base

- 1. Repeat the step 1 to 3 in Section 10.1.
- View will display, then press ▲ or ▼ to select Edit, then press Ok.
- 3. Edit a number, then press **Ok**.
- 4. Edit a name, then press **Ok**. You hear confirmation tones.

Note: during entering number or name, you can correct a number or a letter by pressing , then last number or letter will be removed.

10.4. Delete a speed dial entry

Through both cordless handset and telephone base

- 1. Repeat the step 1 to 3 in Section 10.1.
- 2. **View** will display, then press ▲ or ▼ to select **Delete**, then press **Ok**.
- 3. **Confirm?** will display, then press **Ok**. You hear confirmation tones.

11. CALLER DISPLAY (network dependent)

This feature is available if you have Caller ID service with your telephone service provider.

Your phone can store up to 100 received calls with date/time information in the Call List. The number will be shown on the LCD when the phone is ringing. If the number matches with one of the entries in your Private Phonebook, the caller's name stored in the private phonebook will be displayed with the number.

Phonebook, the caller's name stored in the private phonebook will be displayed with the r If the caller number is disabled to send caller information, **Unknown** will display.

If the caller number is not provided, **Private** will display.

In standby, if three unanswered calls with different calling number are received, "3 New Calls" will be

displayed. Each time you review a call list entry marked with icon, the number of new calls decreases by one. When you have reviewed all the new calls, the icon no longer shows.

If the incoming telephone number matches the last 7 digits of a telephone number in your phonebook, the name that appears on the screen matches the corresponding name in your phonebook.

11.1. View the Call List

All received calls are saved in Call List with the latest call putting at the top of the list. When the call list is full, the oldest call will be replaced by a new call. The latest call log is stored only when it is same calling number. When number of digits of incoming number is more than 10, it will show first 9 digits in first page, then, you can press \bigstar key to view all digits.

In idle mode,

Through telephone base:

- Press P key, or Press Menu and ▲ or ▼ to select Call List.
- Press OK, the call list will be shown. The unanswered call which has not been read is marked with a **
 at the end of the number.
- 3. Press \triangle or ∇ to select the desired entry.
- 4. Press **OK**, to see more detail information of the desired entry.

Through cordless handset:

- Press ^{□K}_{MENU}, then press ▲ or ▼ to select Call List, then press ^{□K}_{MENU} to review the calling number display history.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to browse the call log.
- 3. Press MENU, **View** will show.
- Press DK to view the details of the call log including date and time. (Date/Month and Time appears in left and right sides of lower row respectively)
- 5. Press to return previous menu or long press to return to standby mode.

11.2. Store a Call List Number into the Phonebook

Through telephone base:

- 1. Select a desired entry in the call list, and then press **Ok**.
- Press Ok and ▲ or ▼ to select Add To PB.

Through cordless handset:

- 1. Select a desired entry in the call list, and then press MENU.
- 2. Press \triangle or ∇ to select **Add To PB**, and then press $\bigcap_{M \in M_1} K$
- 3. Call number appears press M_{MNI}^{CK} to confirm.
- 4. Call name appears if there is blank name, you can add the name.
- 5. Press of to confirm. You hear confirmation tones.

11.3. Store a Call List Number into the Black List

Through telephone base:

- 1. Select a desired entry in the call list, and then press **Ok**
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Add To Block**, and then press **Ok**.
- 3. Call number appears press **Ok** to confirm.
- 4. Call name appears if there is blank name, you can add the name.
- 5. Press **Ok** to confirm. You hear confirmation tones.

Through cordless handset:

- 1. Select a desired entry in the call list, and then press $\frac{\Box K}{MENU}$.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select Add To Block, and then press MENIL.
- 3. Call number appears press MENIII to confirm.
- 4. Call name appears if there is blank name, you can add the name.
- 5. Press $\frac{OK}{MENI}$ to confirm. You hear confirmation tones.

11.4. Delete an entry in the Call List

Through telephone base:

- 1. Select a desired entry in the call list, and then press **Ok**.
- Press Ok and ▲ or ▼ to select Delete.
- 3. **Confirm?** will show, press **Ok** to confirm. You hear confirmation tones.
- 4. Repeat steps 3 in part 5.2.4.

Through cordless handset:

- Select a desired entry in the call list.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Delete**, and then press OK MENIL.
- 3. **Confirm?** appears press $\prod_{i \in N_i} to$ confirm. You hear confirmation tones.

11.5. Delete the entire list of the Call List

Through telephone base:

- 1. Select a desired entry in the call list.
- Press Ok and ▲ or ▼ to select Delete All.
- 3. Confirm? will show.
- 4. Press Ok. You hear confirmation tones.

Through cordless handset:

- 1. Select a desired entry in the call list.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Delete All, and then press MENU.
- 3. **Confirm?** will show, Press MENIII to confirm. You hear confirmation tones.

11.6. Call Waiting

You hear a tone in the handset earpiece if someone calls while you are already on a call.

Using handset or speaker mode from the combo base

- Long press R key on combo base to put your current call on hold and take the new call.
- Long press R key on combo base to switch back and forth between calls.

Using handset or speaker mode from the handset

- Long press R key on cordless handset to put your current call on hold and take the new call.
- Long press R key on cordless handset to switch back and forth between calls.

12. CALL BLOCK

This telephone is built-in with Smart Call Block feature*. This feature will help you avoid nuisance calls by only allowing some numbers to make your phone ring.

*This feature requires Caller ID service from your telephone service provider

CALL BLOCK OVERVIEW

Setting	Explanations
Off	Call Block function (Block all call with numbers) is Disabled. This is the default mode.
On	Call Block function is set to Manual. Numbers registered in the black list will not go through and the phone will ring silently. Numbers can be added to the list while the phone is ringing and / or after a call (to enable, see part 12.1).
Contacts	In this automatic mode, any number not registered to your phonebook will be automatically be blocked and not cause your phone to ring. All calls from contacts registered to your phonebook will proceed normally. When this mode is chosen, Contacts OK is displayed on LCD in idle mode unless you have unread messages/missed calls (to enable, see part 12.6.2).
VIP	In this second automatic mode, only calls from contacts registered as VIP in your phone-book will go through and cause your phone to ring. Any other number will not ring. When this mode is chosen, VIPS OK is displayed on the LCD in idle mode unless you have unread messages / missed calls (to enable, see part 12.6.2).
ANONYMOUS	This extra feature allows you to block call that do not have a number attached to them (ie private calls, international calls, etc). This option can be enabled on top of any of the previous four (to enable, see part 12.7).

12.1. Manual call block mode

Manual call block is the easiest option when starting out. When you chose ON in the call block settings, all calling numbers registered in your block list will be blocked. You can add/remove numbers from that list at any time.


How to block an incoming call:

When the phone is ringing and before answering, press $\mathbf{0}$. It will terminate the call and offer you the option to register the number to the block list in one click. Then to confirm the registration of this number in the block list, press $\mathbf{0}\mathbf{k}$.

IMPORTANT: if you don't confirm, the number will not be added to the block list and the next call will go through normally.

NOTE: All the procedures described below (to 12.1.1 to 12.8) can also be performed from the telephone base. From there, the only difference is that the icon \equiv / $_{\text{MENU}}^{\text{DK}}$ described below corresponds to the telephone base key.

12.1.1. Enable MANUAL mode



In idle mode,

Press $\stackrel{\square K}{\text{MENU}}$, press \triangle or ∇ to select **Call Block**.

Press □K press ▲ or ▼ to select **Block Set**.

Press $\underset{\text{MENLI}}{\text{DK}}$, press \triangle or ∇ to select **On** (manual mode).

OR

In idle mode, press **7** to access **Block Set.** directly.

After you enable this option, the call block icon will be displayed on the LCD.

12.2. Add numbers to Block list

In idle mode,

- Press key, Call Block and its icon is displayed, then press or to select Block list, press key, to show Block list numbers.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select numbers stored in Block list.
- 3. Press $_{MENU}^{OK}$ to select **Add new**, enter number to be blocked, press $_{MENU}^{OK}$ to save.

NOTE: 1 more ways to add incoming and outgoing call numbers in Block list:

From incoming call numbers

Press $?^{\blacktriangle}$, to enter Call list, press \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown to select the stored numbers in Call List.

Press Menu, press ▲ or ▼ to select the Add to Block.

Press **Ok** to show selected number, press $\frac{OK}{MENU}$ to save to Block list.

12.3. Edit numbers in Block List

In idle mode,

- 1. Repeat step 1 and 2 in Section 12.2. to select the stored numbers.
- 2. Press $_{MENU}^{\square K}$, press \triangle or ∇ to select **Edit**, start to edit selected number press $_{MENU}^{\square K}$ to save.

12.4. Delete a number in Block list

- 1. Repeat step 1 and 2 in Section 12.2. to select the stored numbers.
- 2. Press $\bigcap_{k=1}^{K}$, press \triangle or ∇ to select **Delete, Confirm?** is shown, and then press $\bigcap_{k=1}^{K}$ to confirm.

12.5. Delete all numbers from Block list

- 1. Repeat step 1 and 2 in Section 12.2. to select the stored numbers.
- Press ^{OK}_{MENU}, press ▲ or ▼ to select **Delete All** to delete at a time, press ^{OK}_{MENU}, **Confirm?** is shown, and then press ^{OK}_{MENU}, to confirm.

12.6. Automatic call block mode



12.7. Anonymous call block mode

12.7.2. Block All Anonymous Calls

This mode will block all unknown incoming calls, including private calls, international calls, pay phone and other out-of-area calls.

In idle mode,

- After you enable this option, the call block icon will be displayed on the LCD.

12.8. Set Block Anonymous Calls OFF

- 2. Press **Ok**, press ▲ or ▼ to select **Off**, press **Ok** to confirm.

13. VOICEMAIL (Network Dependent)

By subscription to your telephone service provider, you can have your calls diverted to a voicemail box when you are absent. For more details, contact your operator.

When new messages are received, **To** appears on the screen. The **TO** disappears once you have consulted the voicemail messages.

To reset the voicemail indicator:

- Press Ok to select Call list.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Voice Mail.
- 3. Long Press key 4, and then **50** should disappear.

14. ANSWERING MACHINE

The total storage capacity for the outgoing message, messages and memos is approximately 30 minutes. Note: Your answering system will answer call after 14 rings even when the answering machine is turned off. This is to allow the remote access feature to work.

14.1. Turn On/Off the Answering Machine

If you turn the answering machine on, it answers calls and records messages.

The red message LED 🕶 on the telephone base is on and the 🔼 icon on the handset will be on too.

Through telephone base:

Press (b) key on the base to turn the answering machine on or off.

Note: When Answering machine is off, the red message LED 귮 on the telephone base will be off and the 🔼 icon on the handset will be off too.

Through Cordless Handset:

- 4. Press \triangle or ∇ to select **On** or **Off**, then press $\bigcap_{M \in \mathbb{N} \cup \mathbb{N}} \mathbb{N}$ to save. You hear confirmation tones.

14.2. Message Playback

If 2 new voice messages are stored in the phone, "2 New Msgs" will appear

and the **TO** icon will flash on the handset screen, the red message LED en the telephone base will flash. If memory is full, **Mem. Full** will display in the screen.

Listen new messages through the Cordless Handset:

- 1. Press \prod_{MENII}^{OK} in idle mode.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select Ans. Machine, then press WENT.
- To play new messages, press of to select Playback.
- Time and date of the message played will display on the screen if listened through handset.
- After end of all messages, "End of Messages" will appear.

14.3. Options during playback

- Slide up or down on side of handset to adjust the speakerphone volume.
- Press 6 to skip to the next message.
- Press 4 to repeat the message currently playing.
- Press 4 twice to listen to the previous message.
- Press 2 to delete the current message.

14.4. Listen new messages through the Base

- Press ►/■ to listen to new messages through base speaker. After playback all new messages, a long beep will emit from the base.
- 2. To playback old messages, press ▶/■ again to listen.

- Press to repeat the message currently playing.
- Press \(\int\) to delete the current message.
- Press ▶/■ to stop.
- Press | | | b to reduce the playback speed.

14.5. Delete Old Messages in the Answering Machine

14.5.1. Delete all old messages through the Handset

- 1. Press $\underset{MENU}{\square K}$ in idle mode.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Ans. Machine**, then press OK MENII.
- 3. MSG Playback appears and then press ▲ or ▼ to select Delete All, then press OK MENU.
- 4. The handset displays **Confirm?**. Then press M_{MENLI}^{OK} to confirm.
- 5. The handset displays **Deleted...** and then **Deleted** is shown. You hear confirmation tones.

14.5.2. Delete a message through the Base

- 1. Press ▶/■ to listen new or old messages through base speaker.
- 2. Press \(\bar\) to delete the message being listened. You hear confirmation tones.

14.5.3 Delete all old messages through the Base

1. During idle mode, long press \bigcap to delete all old messages. You hear confirmation tones.

14.5.4. Record a Memo

NOTE: All the procedures described below can also be performed from the telephone base. From there, the only difference is that the icon M_{NNI}^{CK} described below corresponds to the telephone base key.

- Each memo can be up to 4 minutes in length.
- Memos shorter than two second are not recorded.

14.6. Outgoing Message (OGM)

The telephone is preset with a greeting that answers calls with "please leave a message after the tone." You can use this default outgoing message, or replace it with your own.

Through cordless handset:

- 1. Press $\prod_{M \in N(1)}^{\mathbb{C}K}$ in idle mode.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select Ans. Machine, then press MENII.
- 3. MSG Playback appears and then press ▲ or ▼ to select Tam Settings, then press □K
- 4. Ans & Rec appears and then OK ...
- 5. Play OGM appears then press Ok, Playing... appears then it will play the default outgoing message.

14.6.2. Record your own Outgoing Message (OGM)

Through telephone base:

- 1. Repeat step 1 to 4 in Section 14.6.1.
- 2. Play OGM appears and then press ▲ or ▼ to select Rec. OGM, and then press Ok.
- 3. **Recording...** appears and then you can record your outgoing message after beep tone.
- 4. After finishing record, press Ok.

Notes:

- Your outgoing message can be up to 90 seconds in length.
- Outgoing messages shorter than two seconds are not recorded.

Through cordless handset:

- 1. Repeat step 1 to 4 in Section 14.6.1.
- 2. **Play OGM** appears on the screen, then press ▼ to select **Record**, and then press **Ok**.
- 3. Recording... appears and then you can record your outgoing message after beep tone.
- 4. After finishing record, press **Ok**, **Playing...** appears then it will playback your own outgoing message.

14.7. Delete your Outgoing Message

Through telephone base:

- 1. Repeat step 1 to 2 in Section 14.6.1.
- Delete All appears and then press ▲ or ▼ to select OGM, then press Ok.
- Ans & Rec appears and then press Ok.
- 4. Play OGM appears, then ▲ or ▼ to select Delete, and then press Ok.
- 5. **Delete** will show, You hear confirmation tones.

Through cordless handset:

- 1. Repeat step 1 to 4 in Section 14.6.1.
- 2. Play OGM appears on the screen, then press ▼ to select Delete, and then press MENU.
- 3. You hear confirmation tones.

14.8. Answering Machine Settings

14.8.1. Set the Answer Mode

By default, the answer machine is set in Ans & Rec mode which allows callers to leave a message. This mode can be changed to Answer Only which does not allow callers to leave a message. In that case, your callers will be prompted to call back later.

Through telephone base:

- Press = and ▲ or ▼ to select Ans. Machine.
- Press Ok and ▲ or ▼ to select TAM Settings.
- 3. Press **Ok** and **△** or **▼** to select **Answer Mode**
- Press Ok and ▲ or ▼ to select Ans & Rec or Answer Only.
- 5. Press **Ok** to confirm.

14.8.2. Set the Answer Delay

You can set the number of rings before the answering machine answers and starts playing your OGM. You can set the answering machine to answer after 2 to 10 rings or TOLL SAVE.

With TOLL SAVE selected, the answering machine answers after 2 rings when you have new messages, and after 4 rings when you have no new messages.

Through telephone base:

- 1. Press Menu in idle mode.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Ans. Machine, then press Ok.
- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **TAM Settings**, then press **Ok**.
- 4. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Answer Delay**, then press **Ok**.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select 2, 4, 6, 8, 10 rings, then press Ok to save. You hear confirmation tones.

Through cordless handset:

- 1. Press OK in idle mode.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select Ans. Machine, then press MENU.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select TAM Settings, then press OK MENU.
- 4. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Answer Delay**, then press OK
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select 2, 4, 6, 8, 10 rings, then press OK, to save. You hear confirmation tones.

14.8.3. Recording Time

You can set the maximum length of the recording time of the incoming messages.

Through telephone base:

- Repeat step 1 to 3 in Section 14.8.1.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Record Time, then press Ok.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select 60s, 120s, 180s, then press Ok to save. You hear confirmation tones.

Through cordless handset:

- 1. Repeat step 1 to 3 in Section 14.8.1.
- 2. Press \triangle or ∇ to select **Record Time**, then press $\bigcap_{M \in \mathbb{N}_1} \mathbb{N}$.
- 3. Press \triangle or ∇ to select **60s**, **120s**, **180s**, then press $\bigcup_{M \in \mathbb{N}_1}^{DK}$ to save. You hear confirmation tones.

14.8.4. Answering Machine Remote Access

You can access the answering machine remotely by dialling your fixed telephone number from any touch-tone telephone.

Your phone lets you check your messages, or otherwise operate your answering machine, by calling the answering machine when you are away from home by entering a 4-digit remote access PIN on a tone-dialing phone. By default, the 4-digit remote access code is 0000. It is highly advised to modify it for privacy issues.

14.8.5. Activate Remote Access

Through cordless handset

- 1. Press MENU in idle mode.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select Ans. Machine, then press MENU.
- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **TAM Settings**, then press OK
- 4. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Remote Acc.**, then press □K ...
- 5. Press \triangle or ∇ to select **On** or **Off**, then press $\bigcup_{k=1}^{n}$ to save. You hear confirmation tones.

14.8.6. Change the remote code:

Through telephone base:

- 1. Repeat step 1 to 3 as above.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Change Pin**, then press **Ok** to enter a 4-digit number.
- 3. Press **OK** to save. You hear confirmation tones.

Through cordless handset:

- 1. Repeat step 1 to 3 as above.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Change Pin**, then press on to enter a 4-digit number

14.9. How to Access Remotely to your Answering Machine?

You can ring your phone from another tone-dialing phone to switch on or off the answering machine and listen to your messages remotely.

- 1. Place a call from a tone-dialing phone to your phone.
- 2. When the answering machine answers the calls and starts playing the outgoing message, enter ★ key and then 4-digit remote access code (0000 is the preset code).
- 3. Then the following description will operate by pressing the following key in your tone-dialing phone.

Keys	Description
2	Delete the message currently being played.
4	Repeat the current message or press twice for the previous message.
5	Play all messages.
6	Skip to the next message.
7	Turn on the answering machine.
9	Turn off the answering machine.

Note:

- After 5 seconds of key inactivity, the answering machine automatically cuts off communication.
- When the answering machine is turned off, the telephone answers after 14 rings, and plays the outgoing message.

14.10. Call Screening

When the answering machine is set to ON and when there is an incoming message, the base will start call screening if call screening is set to ON after the preset numbers of rings of answer delay, press **OK** to screen the call on your handset too.

At any time if you want to pick up the call, you can press \mathcal{L} on the handset, or press \mathbb{L} on the telephone base, or pick up combo handset and the message recording will be stopped automatically. If the answering machine is in the process of recording, the message already stored will be saved.

Through the telephone base:

- 1. Repeat step 1 to 3 in Section 14.6.1. (set answer delay)
- 2. BS Screening will display, then press Ok.
- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select between **On** and **Off**, then press **Ok** to save. You hear confirmation tones.

Through cordless handset:

- 1. Repeat step 1 to 3 in Section 14.6.1.
- 2. **BS Screening** will display, then press MENU.
 - . Press ▲ or ▼ to select between **On** and **Off**, then press MENU to save. You hear confirmation tones.

Options while a message is being recorded in the telephone base:

- Slide up/down and on the side of base to adjust the speaker volume.
- Press ►/■ to temporarily turn off the feature.

Options while a message is being recorded in the cordless handset:

- Press ^{OK}_{MENU} to temporarily turn on the feature if it is set to off.
- Slide up or down on side of handset to adjust the speakerphone volume.
- Press to temporarily turn off the feature.

14.11. Message Alert Tone

When the message alert tone is set to On, the telephone base beeps every 10 seconds to alert you to new messages.

The tone stops when all new messages have been reviewed.

Through telephone base:

- 1. Press Menu in idle mode.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Ans. Machine**, then press **Ok**.
- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Tam Settings**, then press **Ok**.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Msg Alert, then press Ok.
- 5. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **On** or **Off**, then press **Ok** to confirm. You hear confirmation tones.

Through cordless handset

- L. Press OK in idle mode.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select Ans. Machine, then press MENI.
- 3. Press \triangle or ∇ to select **Tam Settings**, then press $\bigcap_{M \in \mathbb{N}_1} \mathbb{I}$.
- 4. Press ▲ or ▼ to select Msg. Alert, then press ♣ or ▼.
- 5. Press \triangle or ∇ to select **On** or **Off**, then press $\bigcup_{M \in ML}$ to confirm. You hear confirmation tones.

Pressing any telephone base key temporarily silences the message alert tone.

The message alert tone plays with the next incoming message.

16. TROUBLESHOOTING

If you have difficulty with your phone, please try the suggestions listed below.

As a general rule, if a problem occurs, remove the batteries from all the handsets in your installation for about 1 minute, then disconnect and reconnect the power supply to the base and reinstall the handset batteries.

Phone does not work

- Make sure you installed the batteries correctly.
- Check that the power is correctly connected for the charger.

"NO LINE" appears in the screen

- Is the telephone cord plugged into the phone jack?
- Only use the telephone cord supplied with the phone.
- The telephone line cord might be malfunctioning. Install a new telephone line cord.
- Disconnect the telephone and connect a different telephone. If there is no dial tone on this telephone, the
 problem is in your wiring or local service. Contact your local telephone company.

No dial tone

- Is the telephone cord plugged into the phone socket?
- Check that the power is switched on.
- Only use the telephone cord supplied with the phone.
- The telephone line cord might be malfunctioning. Install a new telephone line cord.
- Move the cordless handset closer to the telephone base. It might be out of range.
- Disconnect the telephone and connect a different telephone. If there is no dial tone on this telephone, the
 problem is in your wiring or local service. Contact your local telephone company.

Cannot dial out or receive calls

- Check that the power is correctly connected.
- The battery may need recharging.
- Has there been a power cut? If so, place the handset back on the base for 10 seconds and try again. If
 it still does not work disconnect the batteries and power adapter for 10 minutes, then reconnect and try
 again.
- If you are connected to a PABX, check whether you need to dial an access code.

Your own voice cannot be announced when the telephone number of incoming call is same as ${\bf 1}$ of 4 photo memories stored

- The ringer volume may be switched off.
- Voice recording in 1 of 4 photo memories was not done successfully. Please refer to Section 5.5.2. to record again.
- Your telephone line may not be subscribed or availability of the service from the fixed line operator.

Cordless handset does not ring (Caller ID)

- The ringer volume may be switched off.
- Check that the power is correctly connected.
- Make sure the cordless handset is registered to the base.

No display in cordless handset

- The batteries may be flat, dead or incorrectly inserted.
- Recharge or replace the batteries

Handset displays "PUT ON BS TO POWER"

- Check that the power is correctly connected.
- Check that the cordless handset is within range of the base.

No voice tag announcement from cordless handset during ringing

It should become normal after 1 minute in idle mode without any operation of the phone.

You hear the busy tone when you press / key on handset

- Make sure the cordless handset is in range of the base.
- Another cordless handset registered to your telephone base may be on the line.

No sounds or noise when using corded handset

Make sure the coil cord connector between base and handset firmly plug.

No key tone on Base

Check key tone setting is on.

Buzzing noise on my phone or on other electrical equipment nearby

- Sometimes your phone can interfere with other electrical equipment if it is placed too close. It is
 recommended that you place your phone at least one metre away from electrical appliances or metal
 obstructions to avoid any risk of interference.
- If you have an ADSL internet service ensure correct filters are installed to prevent interference.

Answering machine does not record any messages

- Make sure the answering machine is switched on.
- The memory may be full, please delete some old messages to free up space.

Cannot access your messages from another phone

- Have you changed the remote access security PIN code?
- Make sure you are calling from a touch-tone telephone. When dialling a number, there should be tones.
- The answering machine might not detect the remote access code when your outgoing message is playing.
 Try again to press remote access code quickly.

• There might be interference on the telephone line you are using. Press the dial pad keys firmly when dialing. **Voicemail and TO show on the display and I don't know why.**

Your telephone has voicemail indication that is separate from the built-in answering system. If **To** appears on the display, then your telephone has received a signal from your telephone service provider that you have a voicemail message waiting for you to retrieve from your telephone service provider. Contact your telephone service provider for more information on how to access your voicemail.
